

How Will the Proposed Relief Package be Financed?

The relief package is equivalent to:

10% of total revenue estimated for 2022

24% of capital expenditure for 2022


6% of total expenditure for 2022

Any new spending that is not authorized through the 2022 budget would require a **Supplementary Estimate** to be approved by parliament.

However,

In paragraph 5.4.4 of the 2022 budget speech, the Finance Minister committed to not permitting supplementary estimates in 2022.

In the event there is no increase in revenue and no reduction in approved expenditure, the relief package will result in an increase in the budget deficit by 14.6%
